Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh Welcomes New Trustees

(PITTSBURGH, PA – January 27, 2010) Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh's Board of Trustees announces the appointment of six new members and the election of one Life Trustee

Gregory A. Zovko, Vice President & Controller at United States Steel Corporation, headquartered in Pittsburgh, PA, was elected to serve as a Term Trustee. Mr. Zovko joined United States Steel in 1983 as a Management Associate in the Accounting and Finance Department of Mon Valley Works, one of the company's steel facilities near Pittsburgh. He progressed through a series of increasingly responsible positions in corporate audit and accounting before being named controller for Mon Valley Works' Clairton Plant in 1997; controller for the entire Mon Valley Works (four facilities) in 1999; assistant controller-operations accounting & financial analysis in 2002; controller-flat-rolled products and assistant corporate controller in 2007; and vice president - accounting in 2008. He was appointed to his current post in April 2009, adding the role of chief compliance officer to his responsibilities. Mr. Zovko holds a bachelor's degree in Accounting from The Pennsylvania State University, a master's degree in Business Administration from The University of Pittsburgh, and a master's degree in Tax Administration from Duquesne University. He is also a Certified Public Accountant.

Kristen Baginski, Deputy Chief of Staff for Pittsburgh Mayor Luke Ravenstahl, will serve as the Mayor's representative to the Library Board. Before joining Mayor Ravenstahl's administration in 2007 Ms. Baginski worked as a Legal Analyst at Lexis Nexis from 1999-2002 and as a Research Librarian for the University of Maryland School of Law from 2004-2007. Ms. Baginski earned a bachelor's degree in English and Political Science from Washington and Jefferson College, a doctor of law degree from The Dickinson School of Law and a master of library and information science degree from the University of Pittsburgh.

Pittsburgh City Council President Darlene Harris also announced the appointment of four council members to serve as the City's representatives to the Library Board. New members include **Patrick Dowd** (District 7); **Bruce Kraus** (District 3); **Darlene Harris** (District 1); and **Natalia Rudiak** (District 4).

In addition, **Lou Testoni**, Market Managing Partner at PricewaterhouseCoopers, was elected to a Life Trustee position. Mr. Testoni currently serves as the Chair of the Library Board's Finance Committee and has been a member of the Board of Trustees since 2005.
